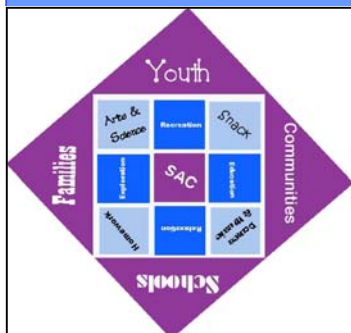

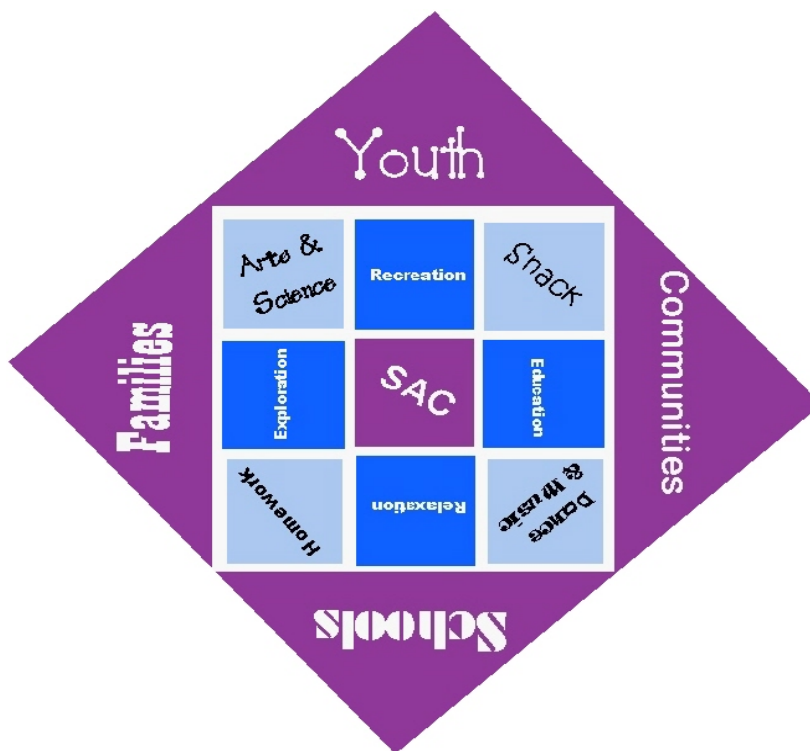

## National Afterschool Association Conference (NAA) Report

Joyce Lang, PENN SACCA Co-Chair represented PENN SACCA at the 19<sup>th</sup> Annual NAA Conference in March. This record-setting event attracted more than 3,000 participants from every state and five countries and featured more than 330 professional development opportunities, with an inspirational keynote by LaVar Burton.

One issue of national concern is the relationship between the NAA Affiliates and the Mott Foundation funded state afterschool networks. The Mott Foundation funded network in PA is PSAYDN (Pennsylvania Statewide Afterschool/Youth Development Network). PENN SACCA and PSAYDN are working closely together to support our mutual interests. Angie and her staff created a **"Guess Who?"** game. Staff purchased a variety of props at a dollar store and children dressed up, some wearing different styles of sunglasses, others sporting boas or summery tops, others wearing fake nose pieces or jewelry. Each child was photographed and duplicates were made. The pictures were glued onto construction paper and laminated. The games began. Because the children were involved in the process, the activity soared to great heights in the center.

## CHALLENGING SCENARIOS TO STIMULATE CHILDREN'S IMAGINATIONS

Have children:

1. Design a cruise ship just for kids.
2. Design a game that combines the skills of soccer and football.
3. Create a mascot for your childcare center. Draw it. Name it. Create an oral or written history for the mascot.
4. Using toothpicks, pipe cleaners, tinfoil, wax paper, paperclips, and/or golf balls, move a sheet of paper from one table to an adjacent table separated by two feet. Use your items to assist you in the process, but you may not touch the paper as it moves between the tables.
5. Using the materials in #4, create a design for a gymnasium.

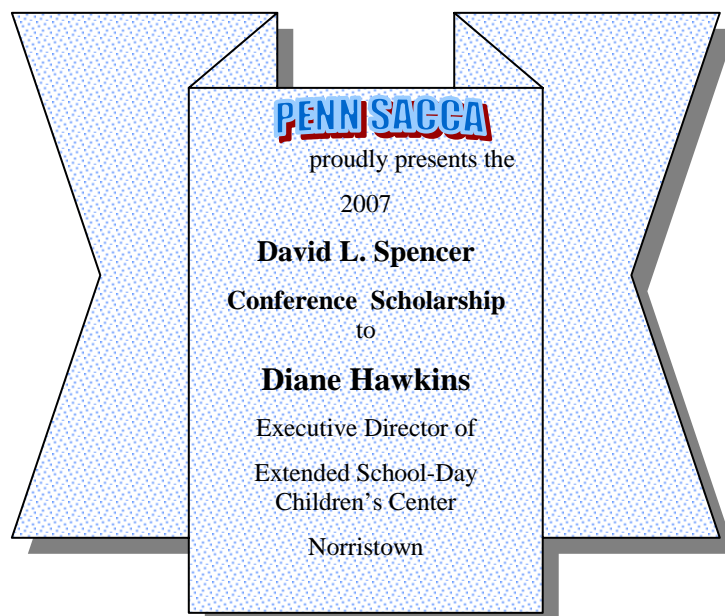
